6.3.1 Curriculum Development

Since our college is an affiliated college, we follow the syllabus prescribed by the University. Once in every three years, the University revises its syllabus by consulting the senior staff members of respective departments. **Six** of our college professors hold the position as chair person in Board of studies and **BOS member** at Alagappa university, other autonomous Colleges and other University and they contribute in improving the curriculum.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

Chalk and talk method is being followed in addition to the power point presentations. Even though it is an old method, since the college is situated in a rural backward area, the inputs are not as much as expected. Moreover, resource persons are invited from various recent studies and we open the gate way for learning new things. Similarly students are allowed to participate seminars and symposiums organised in nearby colleges to enrich their learning process.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation

Each staff conducts weekly tests at the class room level. Every department conducts three test per semester to evaluate the internal marks of the students. The slow learners are brought to notice of the HOD and they are warned and conducted remedial test for their poor performance if necessary. Apart from these tests, two tests are conducted at the college level out of which one is university model centralised test. Poor performers are brought to the notice of HOD and Principal and remedies are carried out.

6.3.4 Research and Development

We have two research Departments. Two major research projects are going on. 12 research papers were published by the staff in National and international level. Two out of six scholars registered for Ph.D. in the department of commerce under the guidance of Dr.A. Abbas Manthiri, Principal of our college were awarded Ph.D. during this academic year 2016-17. During this academic year four staff members acted as external examiner and conducted Ph.D.viva in other colleges. Seven staff members are have guideship in various universities for guiding Ph.d. degree.

6.3.5 Library, ICT and physical infrastructure / instrumentation

Automated library is available with more than 19,600 E-Books.

We have three computer labs with ICT facilities in addition to all department are having Computers individually with internet and WiFi facility.
